

## Simple Rules

- Nominate a leader, photographer, researchers, and note-taker. Make sure the roles are spread out evenly within your group.
- Use the coin to break any deadlocked decisions.
- Pick a maximum of three items to help you with your tableau.
- **Photographs must be taken in landscape. Turn your phone lengthwise so that you are holding it with both hands.**
- Collect your 'making concepts visual' kit.

## Task 1

Move so that you are sitting in the same section as your seminar classmates. Now divide yourselves into small groups, preferably 5 or 6 students.

You will have choice between one of four concepts to pick them – as indicated in your packs.

Once you have decided which concept your group will represent visually, via the tableau, take your packs and head out to brainstorm your ideas.

Your group can use one of the following designated rooms: Camilla's seminar group – rooms 1.09 and 1.11 Bush House SE; George's seminar group – rooms 2.07 and 2.08 Bush House SE; and Roxana's seminar group 2.09 Bush House SE.

## Task 2

Use the poster paper to write down your initial ideas. What is the concept about? How does it relate to environmental issues? How might it be visualised?

Once finished, make sure to take a photograph of your poster. **The photograph must be taken in landscape.** Turn your phone lengthwise so that you are holding it with both hands.

Complete by 12.55pm.

## Task 3

Go outside and create your tableau. You can go anywhere, use anything, but just make sure you are back in the lecture room, 2.09 Bush House SE, by **13.30pm at the very latest.**


Take a photograph of your tableau, in landscape.

Complete by 13.20pm.

## Task 4

It's now time to turn the photographs of your poster and your tableau into a GIF. To do this, follow the steps below:

1. Save both your photographs to a desktop. You may want to label them to make it easier to find them (e.g. ESP poster, ESP tableau).
2. Go to this website: <https://ezgif.com/maker>
3. Click on the "choose files" tab – as indicated in the red box below.



4. Choose the two photographs you want to upload and confirm your selection.
5. Click on the blue button "upload and make a GIF!".
6. Change the "delay" setting for both photographs to 175 – see red box below.
7. Change the "delay time" setting to 175 in the "GIF options" box – see red box on page 3.
8. Click the blue button "Make a GIF!" further down the webpage.
9. You will see a preview of the file. Click on the icon of a floppy disk to save the GIF file onto your desktop.

## Task 5

1. 2. Insert your GIF file onto your one of the slides that corresponds with your group number.
3. Save and you are done!

## Animated GIF Maker

(drag and drop frames to change order)



Toggle range of frames:

Delay time:  (in 1/100 of second, changing this value will reset delay for all frames)

Loop count:  (Empty - loop forever)

use global colormap (Use the same set of colors for all frames to reduce file size)

Effects:

crossfade frames

don't stack frames (Remove the frame when it's time to display next one, use for images with transparent background)
