

## LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the end of the course, students will be able to demonstrate:

- An understanding of the concept of leadership and its application in different contexts and at different levels of analysis
- Ability to identify key leadership themes and relate them to particular contexts
- Ability to identify critical leadership processes and gaps in developing regions
- Ability to analyze the relationship between leadership, and security and development outcomes in developing contexts
- Ability to critically examine interventions in specific cases of insecurity or crisis in a developing context to determine the leadership decisions that shaped the outcomes
- An understanding of the ways in which leadership issues in national, regional and global organizations influence leadership processes in developing societies
- An ability to conduct basic research on leadership in security and development contexts and present findings in a professional manner
- Ability to connect formal knowledge (i.e. well-developed concepts, theories and scientific-based observations) with lived experiences
- Ability to identify essential tools for practicing evidence-based leadership
- Ability to engage policy actors in order to understand the leadership decisions that shape policy and the extent to which evidence-based leadership is practiced
