## II. Application Requirements

The King's Student Law Review is seeking to recruit qualified and eager legal scholars for the following positions – (i) Senior Editors and Blog Contributors; (ii) Junior Editors; and (iii) Proof-readers.

The aforementioned positions are open to all law students, academics and practitioners both at King's College London and otherwise. All applicants must meet the following criteria:

- (i) Applicants must have a strong command of the English language.
- (ii) Applicants must have a background in law. Ideally, the Journal looks for students in their final year of an undergraduate degree and above. Although we prioritise PhD students and legal scholars, we are open to occasionally accepting final year BA and MA applicants, should they demonstrate sufficient knowledge of the law, and sharp writing and editing skills.

Applicants who would like to be considered for the positions are invited to submit:

- (i) A CV and a brief cover letter. The cover letter must be no longer than one page. It should clarify which position the applicant wishes to apply for and why they feel that they are qualified for this.
- (ii) An abstract between 200-500 words on an area of law that they find intellectually stimulating.
